BEFORE WE GET STARTED


- Getting "apples-to-apples" is almost impossible
- Goal is to get educated / total clarity
 - Verify business objectives are being met
 - Minimize surprises (hidden costs, scope gaps, etc)
- Purpose is to discuss ongoing costs after the setup
- Sanity check on the vendor & setup price / scope
 - Direct experience
 - Very clearly defined scope / price
 - Get a live demo of exactly what you are getting
 - No screen shots, static images, descriptions
 - * Front end website (product catalog, cart, tracking, etc)
 - × CMS
 - ERP integration (product edits, orders in, orders / invoices out)
 - Check references



- **×** Assumption
 - + Clients want a mission-critical ecommerce site with real-time ERP integration
- Offering Objectives
 - + Complete solution to "run" the website
 - + Enterprise-level hosting




HOSTING




- WSP's monthly fee is to "Run" the website and ERP integration
- "Hosting" a website <> "Running" a website
- Approx 20% of WSP's monthly fee if for hosting
- If you just got "apples-to-apples" competitive pricing on hosting, the price would be several times higher than WSP ENTIRE monthly fee.

NETWORK DESIGN - WSP (SL1)




- All critical web and processing servers are load-balanced
- DB servers are redundant
- DB runs world-class setup (SAN, fiber)
- Network is segmented (so data is not on public facing IP address)
- Servers are single (improves performance and stability)

NETWORK DESIGN - OTHER OPTIONS




ACCESS TO NEW SOFTWARE VERSIONS



- * Approx 25% of WSP's monthly fee is for what the traditional (ERP) software industry calls "maintenance" (we call it "access to new software versions")
- + If you used the same % traditional software companies use (18-20% per year), it is comparable to our ENTIRE monthly fee to "run" the website.
- + If you are not "subscribing" to a company that is actively investing in your software, you will pay for a complete tear-down / rebuild of your website every 2-5 years (the true cost for this is 2-3 x the acquisition cost).


SOFTWARE/ERP INT. MAINTENANCE / SUPPORT





- Approx 40% of WSP's monthly fee is for Website Software and ERP Integration maintenance, monitoring, and support / issue resolution.
- + This is NOT included in ANY hosting fee.
- Only a small portion of this is included in a traditional software company's maintenance fee
- + This will either be
 - NOT DONE = down time, performance issues, lost credibility / sales you aren't even aware of
 - PARTIALLY DONE = will pay an employee (opportunity cost), or a contractor (hourly)
 - DONE COMPLETELY = people have correct training, have a deliberate plan to accomplish, have a process to mature
- + If you have the talent on staff... "Just because you CAN, doesn't mean you SHOULD".
- + If done even PARTIALLY, it will cost you 50% to 500%+ of WSP's entire monthly fee.

CONTENT-DATA SUPPORT



- Approx 10% of WSP's monthly fee is to support your employees in using the CMS (Web Driver)
- + This includes an ongoing investment in training tools / video tutorials
- + This includes live people answering phone calls and emails

CONCLUSIONS

- * You are "hiring" WSP to "run" your website & ERP integration for < 20% (probably < 10%) of the price of ONE IT employee.
 - + We come with servers, software licensing, direct expertise your website and ERP integration software, a passion for the business, and a \$1M+ / year investment in the core software and ERP integration technology that we're making available to you.

Conclusion:

+ WSP's monthly fee is may be more expensive than you thought, but it is justified and completely worth it.
